First Lutheran Church (ELCA)

Chosen by Christ ~ Empowered to Serve

There are many Biblical passages that relate to welcoming the stranger into our midst. To love the other. These span from Genesis 18, where Abraham and Sarah host strangers who visit them, to the New Testament accounts of Jesus who taught and healed Samaritans (who were despised by Jewish people in Jesus's day). The stories of God's love revealed in the gospel going out to all people is central to the story of Jesus and the earliest followers in the Bible.

A pastor friend of mine, Bob Spilman, lives in Buffalo, NY, where he and his wife have lived for decades and raised their children. So, just today, I received emails from his friends group, offering prayers and thoughts, for what happened there. When I learned through these emails that a teenager killed ten people yesterday in a store in Buffalo, New York, and wounded three others, it caught my eye. One of the deadliest racist attacks in U.S. history, eleven of the 13 victims of the shooting were African American. The young man's 180 page manifesto reveals that he was a hate-filled white supremacist. He was a proponent of violence toward those who are a different color than him. This young man's vicious attack on African-American people who were shopping for groceries is mind numbing and tragic. He targeted this store, after researching the neighborhood. The Tops Market on the east side of Buffalo is only five or six blocks from the Lutheran Church of Our Savior where my friend served a total of nine years in two interims. He and his wife are members there. It is a mixed race congregation.

Ruth Whitfield, age 86, was one of the victims of the shooting. She was on her way from visiting her husband at the nursing home, and stopped to pick up groceries. She didn't make it home. "During his 30 years with the Buffalo Police Department, Aaron Salter, Jr. earned a reputation for bravery, with more than one of his exploits recorded in the local newspaper, The Buffalo News. He once chased down an arsonist, the newspaper reported, and another occasion he faced down a burglar armed with a shotgun." (NYTs). He was working at the Tops Market in security, a far safer job, one would think, when the 18-year old entered the store, and Mr. Salter confronted him, but died in the assault. Another of the victims was Pearly Young, age 77, who for 25 years ran a food pantry in Buffalo. Her family said she loved singing, dancing and being with family. She was a mother, grandmother, and missionary. She loved her church. Three of the human faces of this tragedy. Racism is an ugly disease. It can lead to propaganda that leads to murder. I weep as I think of these people who died, who should still be alive. And, like you, wonder how this could happen. Of course, it is just one case of many in recent years, motivated by hatred.

This fills me and millions with lament and grief for our nation, the victims, and this young man. Where did he take this very wrong turn? He was reading literature that was suggesting that Caucasian Americans are being "supplanted" by non-white people. He was immersed in White-supremacist propaganda. He was messed up. He felt called to help remedy this situation by killing people of color, among whom were the three decent, community-minded folks above. People out shopping for groceries.

There is a very tragic history of racism, and white supremacy, in our nation. We are all aware of this. As people of faith, we believe that every person is created "in the image of God" no matter what the color of their skin, hair, or eyes, gender, employment, sexual orientation, economic level, or education. Hatred toward a group of people is a slap in the face of God. We, who claim to be Christ followers must do all we can to acknowledge that all people are created equal, are created in the image of God, and are to be loved.

America is changing and becoming more diverse every decade. I urge us to embrace the differences. I believe we can celebrate that we are a multi-ethnic nation of immigrants. Our nation is more rich and has been enriched by this diversity. Yet, we have a mixed history around the "welcoming" of those different from us.

June 5th is Pentecost Sunday, when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon people of all nations and languages in Jerusalem. This story, as well as so much of the New Testament is a reminder of God's calling to love the neighbor, and to see them as created in the image of God. May the Spirit inspire us to become more like Jesus.
